The Town Clean Up Day is set for April 16th. and begins at 8 a.m. There will NOT be a hazardous waste pickup as Tarrant County is unavailable for this spring. We are re-scheduling them for the fall. You may purchase a voucher for \$47 to take hazardous waste to the Fort Worth facility. Bring your brush and trash to the south end of Town Hall. The entrance will be off of Robin to Winewood. There will be NO ENTRANCE to Winewood from Bowen.

CONSTRUCTION PROJECT UPDATES:

- The Wagonwheel Waterline, Wastewater and Bridge project: The Town is working with Tarrant County to schedule the street overlay which will include all of Wagonwheel from W Park Row to Smith Barry.
- Bowen Road Pavement Repair Project: Phase 2 is on-going and includes the area from Winewood to W Pioneer. When all phases are complete, the road will be re-stripped and new buttons will be placed.
- UPCOMING: The Pioneer Waterline Crossover is out to bid. We do not anticipate any impact to traffic flow or water service. Work is anticipated to start in late April.

Over the next few meetings, the Town Council will be discussing water and sewer rates. Due to its size, the Town sends all of its sanitary sewer effluent to both Fort Worth and Arlington for treatment. In consideration, these cities charge the Town a fee for this. That fee has increased over time, without an equivalent increase in the Town's sewer rate to cover those costs. In addition, the Council will look at the overall water and sewer rates, as well as progress on infrastructure projects, which were last reviewed in 2012.

The Town of Pantego will conduct a General Election for Council Place 1, 2, and 3. The candidates are: Council Place 1: Fred Adair (unopposed); Council Place 2: Don Funderlic and Michael Dement; Council Place 3: Jane Barrett and Jesse Howell. Early Voting will take place at the Junior League of Arlington located at 4002 W Pioneer and begins on April 25th and run through May 3rd. Election day is May 7th between 7 a.m. and 7 p.m. There will be more information on the dates, times, and locations to vote in future newsletters and on the Town's website.
