Mayor and Town Council,

During February, Deputy Chief Franklin prepared and submitted two grant applications:

- State Firefighters' & Fire Marshals' Association SAFER Grant Program: \$531,810
 Purpose: Funding to hire two additional firefighters for three years
- FEMA Hazard Mitigation Grant Program: \$970,000

Purpose: Funding for generators to power critical portions of the water system including well and auxiliary pumps and the SCADA (Supervisory Control and Data Acquisition) monitoring system

At the recommendation of the Texas Department of Emergency Management (TDEM), we opted for natural gas-powered generators rather than diesel. As the Council is aware, our current duty is met via participation in a generator pool but staff continues seeking affordable means of acquiring the equipment necessary to provide safe and uninterrupted water service to our residents by meeting water utility providers' requirements under Senate Bill 3, which is to "ensure the emergency operation of its water system during an extended power outage at a minimum water pressure of 20 pounds per square inch".

A more detailed summary of each grant application is on the following page. We will keep the Council updated regarding these grant applications and potential awards.

HMGP: GENERATORS SCOPE OF WORK SUMMARY

The Town's independent water supply system is sourced from five wells – none of which has an auxiliary power supply (back-up generator) to operate the pumps and SCADA. Therefore, any medium- or long-term loss of power could leave customers without water service – potentially resulting in devastating consequences. Based on average daily usage, a six-hour unmitigated loss of power would deplete all water storage tanks. Upon power restoration and a system restart, a mandatory boil water notice and flushing of the system would be necessary – resulting in a loss of 500,000 gallons of water.

The Town's Hazard Mitigation Plan (HMP) identifies the need for generators at critical facilities, specifically the water supply. The Town has applied for hazard mitigation funding to purchase natural gas-powered generators for the two top-producing wells to protect against losses of power. The project would include, for both locations:

- poured concrete pad;
- 500-kW natural gas-powered generator and transfer switch;
- piping and plumbing of appropriately sized natural gas line;
- electrical hook-up by licensed electrician; and
- appropriate permit and inspections (fees waived).

SAFER GRANT APPLICATION SUMMARY

Pantego is an incorporated community surrounded by the City of Arlington with approximately 25% of the southern border shared with the City of Dalworthington Gardens. We are a suburban residential community with a moderate amount of retail, light commercial, and light industrial businesses. Our career department cross-staffs an engine and ambulance on a 24/48 schedule with a minimum of three members per tour. The current staffing of three per shift provides no buffer for absences or leaves. If anyone is unable to report, the engine is potentially out of service until filled. Fortunately, the department recently received a budget allocation for an additional floating position, which leadership is now in the process of filling via an active hiring list. In the meantime, we address shift absences or vacancies via a small part-time cadre, overtime shifts for full-time members, or by having the Chief or Deputy Chief on duty.

The majority of our station's calls are engine responses under a mutual aid agreement with the City of Arlington. This partnership affords our department the opportunity to train and operate alongside a progressive organization and allows for seamless operations when incidents occur within our own jurisdiction. This auto-aid agreement is critical to the protection of our community as Arlington views us – for all intents and purposes – as one of their stations. Adequate and dependable staffing numbers are, of course, essential to maintaining this deeply valued relationship. Our goal is to fund two additional positions via this grant, so that each shift has four members assigned, affording us the luxury of one member being on leave without significant impacts.





I. CALL TO ORDER AND WELCOME

Mayor Brewster called the meeting to order at 6:00 p.m., welcomed attendees, and asked if there were requests to speak. Hearing none, he moved to the first item.

II. SPECIAL SESSION

A. MAYOR AND COUNCIL REPORTS AND ANNOUNCEMENTS

In response to a question from Mayor Pro Tem Brown, Public Works Director Bob Neal discussed sewer line issues, washouts, and damage to the bridge in Bicentennial Park that had resulted from a recent storm event.

B. DISCUSSION, DECISION, AND ACTION ITEMS

 Discuss and consider adoption of <u>Resolution No. 2023-02</u> Directing Publication of Notice of Intention to Issue Combination Tax and Revenue Certificates of Obligation

Finance Director Sean Smith stated that Hilltop Managing Director Andre Ayala was present to provide updated figures. Mr. Ayala discussed three scenarios (with 20, 25, and 30 year amortizations), stated that combination COs were the recommended instrument as they can be repaid from utility or ad valorem revenues, and that approval of this item would direct staff to complete the required noticing of intent of the Council to consider issuance of up to \$18.5 million during their May 22 regular meeting.

There was some discussion of interest rates, that CO issuance was not subject to election, the Town's bond rating of AA, and the timing of the debt issuance

process. Councilmember Duncan noted a desire to minimize the amortization period as much as the existing budget and revenues would allow.

Finance Director Sean Smith presented to the Council the projected impact of each of the three amortization periods if they were fully funded from either ad valorem or utility revenues. Smith noted that the current tax year had included a more significant increase in property valuations than was usual or expected and, therefore, might result in more property owners challenging those valuations before the coming tax year. Therefore, he presented calculations based on two different total taxable values - the current 2022 tax year valuations versus an average of the prior three years.

There was discussion of the projected impacts on the tax and/or utility rates, how the Town's tax and utility rates compared to other municipalities in the region, the advantages and disadvantages of shorter amortization, and other utility projects that would need separate funding.

Councilmember Duncan requested that staff provide a proposed ratio for dividing the debt burden between property tax and utility rates, keeping in mind not only residents but also commercial customers. There was also discussion amongst the Council of reducing the issuance amount, critical pressure and capacity issues, needed rehabilitation of storage tanks, lifetime maintenance costs of steel-supported versus concrete pedestal towers, and the redundancy that would be provided by an additional elevated storage tank. Following Executive Session, the following action was taken:

MOTION TO APPROVE. **ACTION** APPROVE RESOLUTION NO. 2023-02 DIRECTING PUBLICATION OF NOTICE OF INTENTION TO ISSUE COMBINATION TAX AND REVENUE CERTIFICATES OF OBLIGATION. **MOVED BY** DUNCAN. **SECONDED BY** ROEMMICH. **MOTION PASSED UNANIMOUSLY (5-0-0).**

(2) Water system improvements and updates

Town Engineer Stuart Williams of Kimley-Horn stated that TCEQ had granted full regulatory approval for the reverse osmosis (RO) system and that he and staff were now working on plans and specifications for chemical storage options and coordinating with the Town Attorney on contracts. Williams added that staff expected this item to be ready to send for bid as early as the first of April and that the last item needed was a funding source. In response to Councilmember Kidd, Williams stated that Fort Worth had informally approved the wastewater element.

III. EXECUTIVE SESSION

Mayor Brewster and the Council recessed to Executive from 6:02 to 7:41 p.m., pursuant to §551.071 and §551.072. No action was taken pursuant to Executive. However, the Council did wait until after Executive to make a motion on item 1. Following action on item 1, item 2 was presented and discussed.

WHEREAS, a "Farmers Market" is defined by Section 1.11.071 of the Code of Ordinances as "Events approved by the Town Council, which are the subject of a farmers market agreement in a form adopted by a resolution of the Town Council, to take place during specified dates and times, and which are available to the public. At least 30% of the vendors participating in a farmers market must sell produce or food items or beverages or consumable items."; and

WHEREAS, Section 1.11.076 of the Code of Ordinances outlines requirements of farmers market events in Bicentennial Park including that "A farmers market shall be operated only after a farmers market agreement has been entered ... in a form approved by the Town Council on dates and pursuant to a site plan and operational plan approved by the Town Council.",

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE TOWN COUNCIL OF THE TOWN OF PANTEGO, TEXAS, THAT:

SECTION 1.

The Town Council hereby approves the "Town of Pantego Farmers Market Agreement (Allowing Sales of Beer and Wine)" attached hereto as "Exhibit A". No Farmers Market event shall be allowed to be operated in the Town of Pantego's Bicentennial Park outside of the terms set forth in this agreement or another such agreement approved by the Town Council.

ADDITIONAL TERMS CONDITIONS AND REQUIREMENTS:

Damage Deposit: The reservation of the Town Park Facilities is hereby made by payment herewith of a reservation/damage deposit in the amount of N/A. The damage deposit shall be retained until conclusion of all scheduled Farmers Markets listed above and shall be used to reimburse the Town for damage, if any, caused by the Farmers Market.

Site Plan Requirements: Operator shall provide a site plan map to include the location of vendors, any additional dumpsters or trash or waste receptacles, and the locations of any port-a-let. Such site plan is subject to reasonable review and approval by public safety officials of the Town.

Sound Amplification Prohibited: This Agreement does not allow amplification of sound.

Damage: Operator shall use the Park in a safe, prudent, and responsible manner and only for the usual and intended purpose. Operator shall be liable for any damage resulting to the Park and caused by either the Operator or the persons he or she is responsible for supervising.

General Prohibitions:

No smoking or vaping allowed in the Park. No gambling or fighting permitted. No private attractions, bounce houses, water slides, dunk tanks, mechanical bulls, etc. are permitted in the Park. No improper use of facilities permitted. All Town and State laws must be followed.

Sales of Alcohol: In connection with any scheduled Farmers Market date listed above involving the sale of alcoholic beverages (limited to beer and wine), the Operator shall at least 7 calendar days before the date provide the following to the Town: (1) Identification of and contact information for each vendor of alcoholic beverages; (2) Copies of insurance binders or other appropriate documentation to demonstrate each vendor of alcoholic beverages (limited to beer and wine) has appropriate insurance coverage; (3) Copies of all licenses and permits issued by the State of Texas or any governmental entity authorizing each such vendor to sell alcoholic beverages at events including the Farmers Market; and (4) a site plan showing the area of allowable alcohol possession.

Acceptance of Premises as Is: By signing below, Operator affirms that it has had the opportunity to inspect the premises and Operator accepts said premises in the current condition. The Town assumes no liability for injury to, or damage to property of persons using the Park pursuant to this Agreement.

Compliance with Regulations: Operator shall obey all directions and instructions from authorized Town personnel and all applicable rules and regulations of the Town regarding the use of the Park.

Cleanup: Operator shall leave the Facilities in a clean and orderly condition. All trash shall be disposed of properly and all equipment shall be returned to its designated location. Failure to properly clean the Park after use will result in a forfeiture of cleaning deposit and potentially the perpetual suspension of reservation privileges in the future. Operator shall be responsible for providing or arranging to provide adequate trash and waste receptacles.

Limitation of Liability. Indemnification: Operator agrees that, in the absence of gross negligence by the Town, the Town shall have no liability for damage to or loss of property of its affiliates while such property is on the premises of the Park. Operator further agrees, in the absence of gross negligence by the Town, to indemnify the Town and hold it harmless from any and all claims arising from any injury, including death, to any agent, employee or guest of Operator or its affiliates in connection with any activity hereunder at the Park. Operator further agrees to indemnify the Town and hold it harmless from any and all claims for any damage or injury to persons or property caused by any agent or employee of Operator or its affiliates in or on the Park premises.

The Town of Pantego must be shown as an additional named insured on the insurance declaration.

Signage: The Farmers Market Operator must erect at least 5 signs indicating the area where alcohol possession is allowed.

Miscellaneous: Reasonable rules and standards of conduct prescribed by the Town of Pantego shall be applicable to all persons present in the Park and all such persons shall be subject to the governmental powers of the Town of Pantego. Please see attached Town of Pantego Code of Ordinances Article 1.11 Sections 1.11.071 through 1.11.076 adopted by the Town of Pantego.

Assignment: Any amendment, modification, termination, or rescission affecting this Agreement shall be made in writing, signed by the parties and attached hereto. Operator shall not assign or transfer any rights under this Agreement.

Integration Clause: This Agreement contains the entire understanding between parties with respect to the subject matter herein and supersedes all prior written and oral agreements and representations pertaining hereto.

Severance Clause: The invalidity or unenforceability of any part of this Agreement shall not invalidate or affect the remainder, which shall continue to govern the relative rights and duties of the parties as though the invalid or unenforceable part were not a part hereof.

- C. Lancaster's Purchasing Agent shall be designated as the official representative to act for Lancaster in all matters relating to this cooperative purchasing agreement.

- D. Pantego shall be allowed to purchase goods and services from vendors who have been selected by Lancaster through the competitive bidding process. Pantego will place orders directly with and pay directly to the selected vendor for goods and services purchased through a contract.
- E. All purchases will be within the specifications and under the terms and conditions that have been agreed to by the parties. Pantego shall be responsible for the vendors' compliance with all conditions of delivery, price, and quality of the purchased goods or services.
- F. Pantego's Purchasing Agent shall be designated as the official representative to act for Pantego in all matters relating to this cooperative purchasing agreement.

This Agreement shall take effect upon execution by the signatories and shall be in effect from date of execution until terminated by either party with thirty (30) days' advance written notice.

BACKGROUND

This is a vacant parcel at the southwest corner of Smith Barry Road and Bowen. The adjacent property to the north and south is commercial – with a dental office to the north and an Oncor service center to the south. The properties to the east and west are residential.

The applicant plans to develop the property as commercial office space, which would be in accordance with the existing C-1 zoning category. The land has not



previously been platted, which, as the Council is aware, is necessary before any site plans or construction documents can be submitted for review. Therefore, this preliminary plat is being submitted for Council's consideration.

Staff including Town Engineer Stuart Williams of Kimley-Horn provided comments on the initial submittal and are now comfortable that all concerns have been addressed. Those comments are included in your packet for reference. However, only the most recent preliminary plat submittal is included here.

The Planning and Zoning (P&Z) Commissioners, during a regular meeting on Monday, March 6, voted unanimously to recommend request, with a vote of 4-0, with the following conditions:

STAFF REPORT

TO THE HONORABLE MAYOR AND TOWN COUNCIL

- 1) That the rear walls do not have windows facing the adjacent residences. The applicant has agreed and amended their renderings.
- 2) That the fencing between the property and the adjacent residences be taller than the normally allowed 8 feet. The applicant has agreed to this and our ordinance allows P&Z/Council the authority to allow taller fencing as an exception to the height requirement.
- A traffic study be conducted. Staff has not conducted this study yet as P&Z is a recommending body but will do so at Council's direction prior to the consideration of a Final Plat.
- 4) That the applicant provide a three-year performance bond with regard to the underground detention.

P&Z also had concerns over the exterior color of the proposed buildings; while that's not something we can require, the applicants have revised their rendering to reflect that input.

THE PROPOSED DEVELOPMENT

Though this item does not include any consideration, evaluation, or approval of proposed development of the site, staff is aware that there have been some concerns expressed within community and is, therefore, including renderings provided by the property owner of the various facades of the potential structure, a traffic generation study, and a letter addressing pavement capacity within the site.

As the Council will notice, Buildings 2 and 3 have no westward facing windows (the side of the building abutting residential lots). The owner has also agreed to include in the plans a 10' fence along the property line to offer privacy and buffering for those neighboring residential lots.

Again, such concerns should not affect any consideration of the preliminary plat that is before you now as they will be formally addressed during any potential plan submittal and review process. Staff did want to take this opportunity to assure Council and residents that it does appear that the property owner is prepared to be responsive to concerns of the community and surrounding property owners.

In response to an inquiry from Chief Fulton, a letter regarding pavement capacity has

been provided by the applicant's engineers. A Trip Generation Study is also attached for the Council's review.

The concrete surface provides an all-weather driving capability. This will meet the Town Ordinance 502.2.3 and NCTCOG Amendment 503.2.3 Surface.

The property located at 2600 Smith Barry Road, Pantego, Texas is bounded on the north by Smith Barry Road, on the east by South Bowen Road, on the west by Ivygreen Addition (a residential development), and on the south by Oncor and a Gas Well site. Properties north of Smith Barry Road include a Dental Office complex with a single entrance and a residential lot to the northwest.

A Traffic Generation Study for the Pantego Business Park Development has been conducted. The number of vehicles entering and exiting the site was calculated using the Institute of Transportation Engineers (ITE) Trip Generation Manual 11th Edition factor for Small Office Buildings (ITE Use #712) and the square footage of the buildings. A Small Office Building is defined as a single tenant office with less than or equal to 10,000 square feet. The trip generation rate for a Small Office Building is 2.61 per 1,000 square feet for the AM peak with 60 percent entering and 40 percent exiting the site. The AM peak is considered to occur between 7:00 AM and 9:00 AM. The PM peak is considered to occur between 4:00 PM and 6:00 PM. The rate is 3.15 per 1,000 square feet for the PM peak with 42 percent entering the site and 58 percent exiting the site.

Because there are two entrances traffic could enter from either Smith Barry Road or South Bowen Road. During the peak times it is likely that northbound exiting traffic will use Smith Barry Road and turn left at the existing signal light. The south bound existing traffic will use the South Bowen Road entrance and turn right onto South Bowen Road.

The residents in the adjacent neighborhoods are not expected to be impacted by the additional traffic produced by the offices because South Bowen Road will be the main public street approaching the offices.

Following is a chart with the calculations for the Trip Generation for the buildings proposed with this development. The total trips expected to enter the site during the AM adjacent street peak is 48 vehicles, while the total trips expected to exit the site during the AM adjacent street peak is 32 vehicles. During the PM adjacent street peak the number of vehicles expected to enter the site is 41 and the number of vehicles expended to exit the site is 56.

We have completed our drainage review of the first submittal of the preliminary plat, site plan, drainage plan, sanitary sewer plan, and water plan for the above listed project.

We offer the following comments:

General Comment:

Per Town of Pantego Ordinance, the Fire Department has adopted NCTCOG 2015 Amendments Option B. Under Chapter 903.2.11.9, Buildings Over 6,000 sq. ft.- An automatic sprinkler system shall be installed throughout all buildings with a building area 6,000 sq. ft. or greater and in all existing buildings that are enlarged to be 6,000 sq. ft. or greater.

Preliminary Plat

- 1. Show building and landscape setbacks.
- 2. Show additional easements requested in subsequent comments.

Site Plan

- 1. Building 4 does not meet the minimum setback of 25' from the Smith Barry Road property line.
- 2. Show underground utilities (water & sewer) on next submittal.
- 3. A masonry fence may be required on the western property line unless the buffer provided is 2x the proposed building height. The proposed building height was not given in this submittal.

Water Plan

- 1. Upsize the internal site water line from a 6" to 8" line.
- 2. Add a fire hydrant on the parking lot island on the southeast corner of Building 3.

Sanitary Sewer Plan

- 1. Typical Comment: The sanitary sewer service coming from the buildings can be 4" instead of 8" as shown.
- 2. Provide a utility easement for the 8" line on the western side of building 2.
- 3. Include the 8" sanitary sewer servicing building 5 in a utility easement.
- 4. Add a manhole at the north end of line on the west side of the site where the service line from building 3 enters the 8" line.
- 5. Add a manhole where the service from building 2 enters the 8" line on the west side of the site.
- 6. Add a manhole where the service from building 1 enters the proposed 8" line.
- 7. Building 2 service replace the 90 degree bend shown with 2-45's as shown for building 3.

Drainage Plan

- 1. Include a drainage easement for the concrete drainage flume on the west side of the site.
- 2. Include a note on the drainage plan stating that all on-site storm underground detention and pervious pavers shall be private and shall be maintained by Owner or by BOA, and not the Town of Pantego.
- 3. Consider storm inlets in the pervious pavers to underground detention as an additional factor of safety if pervious pavers become plugged.
- 4. Storm calculations have not been reviewed with the preliminary plat submittal. Calculations will be reviewed during the construction plan submittal phase.

BACKGROUND

As the Council is aware, the purpose of a "fee schedule" is to consolidate all fines, fees, and charges for easier reference by both staff and the public. Currently, our <u>fee schedule</u> lists the pass-through rates charged by the Town via the water bill for <u>trash and recycling</u> <u>services</u>. As these rates are set by contract and amended often, this ordinance would remove the specific rates from the Code and, instead, state that rates can be reviewed either at Town Hall or online. This prevents the passage of an ordinance amending the fee schedule each time the rates change via Council's approval of a contract amendment.

The second purpose of this ordinance is to update a potentially problematic provision of a related <u>portion of the Code</u>, which currently states: "In the event the fee contained in this fee schedule may conflict with the amount provided in the ordinances therein referenced, this fee schedule shall be deemed an amendment to the referenced ordinance." Staff is proposing to update this to state that the fee or ordinance <u>most recently adopted by the Council</u> will take precedent, via this language: "In the event that the fee contained in this fee schedule may conflict with the amount provided in the ordinance most recently adopted by the Council will take precedent, via this language: "In the event that the fee contained in this fee schedule may conflict with the amount provided in the ordinances therein referenced, the latter adopted fee will control."

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING THE CODE OF ORDINANCES OF THE TOWN OF PANTEGO, TEXAS, BY AMENDING APPENDIX A "FEE SCHEDULE," ARTICLE A9.000 "SOLID WASTE," SECTION A9.001, "COLLECTION FEES" TO PROVIDE THAT THE CURRENT CONTRACT RATES WILL BE AVAILABLE FOR REVIEW AT TOWN HALL AND ON THE TOWN'S WEBSITE AND TO REMOVE SPECIFIC REFERENCES TO SUCH SOLID WASTE AND RECYCLING RATES; AMENDING APPENDIX A "FEE SCHEDULE," ARTICLE A1.000 "GENERAL PROVISIONS," SECTION A1.005, "CONFLICTING REGULATIONS" TO ALLOW THE LATTER ADOPTED FEES TO CONTROL WHEN REFERENCING OTHER ORDINANCES; PROVIDING THAT THIS ORDINANCE SHALL BE CUMULATIVE OF ALL ORDINANCES; PROVIDING A SEVERABILITY CLAUSE; AND PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

WHEREAS, the Town of Pantego, Texas, is a Type A general law municipality located in Tarrant County, created in accordance with the provisions of Chapter 6 of the Local Government Code and operating pursuant to the enabling legislation of the State of Texas; and

WHEREAS, the Town has previously adopted a fee schedule for collection of solid waste and recycling for customers or residents of the Town; and

WHEREAS, the Town Council has determined that it is advisable to amend the fee schedule to remove specific reference to the contractually set rates for solid waste and recycling collection; and

WHEREAS, the Town Council has determined that it is necessary to amend Section A1.005 to increase clarity,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE TOWN COUNCIL OF THE TOWN OF PANTEGO, TEXAS, THAT:

SECTION 1.

Section A9.001 of Article A9.000 "Solid Waste" of Appendix A "Fee Schedule" of the Code of Ordinances, Town of Pantego, Texas, is hereby amended to read as follows:

"§ A9.001 Collection fees.

- (a) <u>Fees.</u> Fees related to solid waste and recycling collection will be set by contract and may be subject to an administrative fee of up to 5 percent to be remitted to the Town. Said contract and current rate schedules will be available for review at Town Hall and on the Town's website.
- (b) <u>Sales tax</u>. There shall be added to the above charges such sales tax as may be imposed by state law or as modified by contract."

SECTION 2.

Section A1.005 of Article A1.000 "General Provisions" of Appendix A "Fee Schedule" of the Code of Ordinances, Town of Pantego, Texas is hereby amended to read as follows:

"§ A1.005 Conflicting regulations; references to other ordinances.

- (a) In the event that the fee contained in this fee schedule may conflict with the amount provided in the ordinances therein referenced, the latter adopted fee will control.
- (b) In the event no ordinance is referenced in this fee schedule, then this fee schedule shall constitute full authority for the imposition of the fee or charge without reference to any other ordinance."

SECTION 3.

This ordinance shall be cumulative of all provisions of ordinances and of the Code of Ordinances, Town of Pantego, Texas, as amended, except where the provisions of this ordinance are in direct conflict with the provisions of such existing ordinances and such Code, in which event the conflicting provisions of such ordinances and such Code are hereby repealed.

SECTION 4.

It is hereby declared to be the intention of the Town Council that the phrases, clauses, sentences, paragraphs and sections of this ordinance are severable, and if any phrase, clause, sentence, paragraph or section of this ordinance shall be declared unconstitutional by the valid judgment or decree of any court of competent jurisdiction, such unconstitutionality shall not affect any of the remaining, phrase, clauses, sentences, paragraphs and sections of this ordinance, since the same would have been enacted by the Town Council without the incorporation in this ordinance of any such unconstitutional phrase, clause, sentence, paragraph or section.

SECTION 5.

This ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage, and it is so ordained.



STAFF REPORT TO THE HONORABLE MAYOR AND TOWN COUNCIL



MEETING DATE MONDAY, MARCH 27, 2023

PRESENTER

SANDRA Y. OVERSTREET, Human Resources Director

BACKGROUND

Staff is attaching, for Council's consideration, two estimates for air duct and vent cleaning for all three areas (Town Hall, Fire, and Public Works) of the 1614 S Bowen facility. This service would remove existing dust, dirt, debris, or other contaminants in an effort to improve indoor air quality and guard against potential health problems. It has been several years since the Fire Department had their air ducts cleaned. Town Hall and the Public Works Department have never been cleaned. If approved, staff would expect the work to be completed after hours, if possible.

The first bid (below), Mr. Duct, has also provided a separate cost for the installation of air scrubbers in the system, which use UVC lighting among other processes to destroy 99% or more of airborne and surface contaminants.

- Mr. Duct: \$9,275 (see attachment for detailed estimate)
 - o Optional: Air Scrubbers (\$6,495) at a total of \$15,770
- Tom's Mechanical: \$9,575 (see attachment for detailed estimate)

Staff sought a third estimate from Hughes Mechanical, but it was not provided.

FISCAL IMPACT

STAFF RECOMMENDATION

Staff appreciates the Council's consideration and feels comfortable with either bid. Staff also believes that there could be some benefit to installing the scrubbers as they could lessen the spread of airborne bacteria, colds, flus, and viruses and make the office environment more friendly for anyone suffering from asthma or allergies. We would, therefore, be grateful for the installation of air scrubbers in addition to the duct cleaning but, at this time, the cleaning is the higher priority.
